1. [§4.7, # 42] A particle is moving according to the given acceleration function

$$a(t) = 12t^2 + 6t - 6.$$

If $s(0) = 4$, and $s(1) = 2$, find the position function $s(t)$ of the particle.

2. [§5.1, # 4] Estimate the area under the graph of $f(x) = \sqrt{4 - x^2}$ from $x = 0$ to $x = 2$ using 4 approximating rectangles and
- a. right endpoints.
 - b. left endpoints.

In each case, sketch a graph of the function and the rectangles. Is your estimate an underestimate or an overestimate?

3. [§5.2, # 16] Express the following limit as a definite integral on the given interval. *[Just write the definite integral; do not solve.]*

$$\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{\sin x_i}{x_i} \Delta x, \quad \left[\frac{\pi}{2}, \frac{3\pi}{2} \right]$$

4. [§5.2, # 18] Express the following limit as a definite integral on the given interval. *[Just write the definite integral; do not solve.]*

$$\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{x_i^*}{1 + (x_i^*)^2} \Delta x, \quad [-1, 1]$$

5. [§5.2, # 34] Evaluate the following integral by interpreting it in terms of areas.

$$\int_{-11}^{13} -\sqrt{144 - (x - 1)^2} dx.$$
